Professor Bruce Hollis

Bruce W. Hollis, Ph.D. received his B.Sc. and M.Sc. from the Ohio State University and subsequently his Ph.D. from the University of Guelph in 1979. He then completed an Endocrine Fellowship at The Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine in 1982. Since 1986 Dr Hollis has been Professor of Paediatrics, Biochemistry and Molecular Biology at The Medical University of South Carolina , where he is also Director of Paediatric Nutritional Sciences. Dr. Hollis has studied vitamin D metabolism and nutrition for the past 35 years and has been an NIH grant recipient for the past 30 years. His current work focuses on the vitamin D requirements during pregnancy and lactation. Dr. Hollis has in excess of 200 peer reviewed articles in this area of investigation.
